ANNUAL CARNABY'S COCKATOO NEST-ING SURVEY AT COCANARUP

The original survey was scheduled for October 24-26 but was cancelled due to 107 mm rain in Ravensthorpe earlier that week. In spite of that Deb Sullivan from Birdlife Aust. in Esperance and I covered some of the area over 25 & 26

October as we camped on the west side of the river, which was 100 m wide on Cocanarup Road, until the water level receded to 'top of FWD tyre height'. By Sunday we were able to cross the river and we located nine new nest trees

The survey was re-scheduled on 21 &22 November in much drier conditions when Rosemary Jasper, Ken & Jean Read from Esperance walked many kilometres with very few birds seen or flushed. On 4 December Rick Dawson from DPaW (of ABC TV Carnaby's Documentary fame) and vets from Murdoch University came to Cocanarup to extract chicks from nest hollows to give them a health check including size, weight, DNA sample, eye fluid sample for chlamydia and a leg band. Nest trees that had been previously examined varied from having chicks already flown to the 'python tree' still having two eggs. Last time this nest was checked it had a carpet python with a Carnaby's sized lump in it.

HOPETOUN MARKET DAY

On 17 January seven 'Friends' attended the market day and presented a stall. The highlight was undoubtedly Gil Craig's 'What scat is that?' competition whereby for a small entry fee attendees were invited to match a sample scat against photographs of a range of animals to arrive at the right answers. All correct answers were entered into a box and two winning enteries drawn. Thirty four people including many children entered.

We also provided information on the Twertup rebuild, sold a Ravensthorpe wildflower book, recaptured two lapsed memberships and signed up a new member. The scat competition prize winners were Amber Guerini of Broomehill and Harmony Daw of Ravensthorpe. Prizes were an annual national parks pass and a years Landscope subscription. Department of Parks and Wildlife is gratefully acknowledged for the donation of these prizes.

TWERTUP UPDATE

Another significant milestone has been reached with the building of the walls by master stonemason and craftsman, Paul Young. The beautiful colours of the Twertup spongolite have been shown to their best effect by Paul's stonework. Following the 2008 wildfire, the charred walls looked like they would be a major job to clean, however after a few heavy rainfalls, the walls were revealed to have been 'cooked', further oxidising the iron in the stone and enhancing the red and yellow colours in the spongolite. The multicoloured effect of the new outside walls is truly stunning.

Paul has used the paler spongolite blocks, from both 'Yarrabee' and Ravensthorpe, in the internal walls, providing brighter and lighter rooms. The 'fossil wall' takes pride of place in the sitting room, with some new fossils being incorporated into the feature. A number of volunteers have assisted the stonework by sorting the blocks into various sizes and/or scrubbing paint off the blocks. Special thanks to Warren Stevens who accompanied Paul for much of the time, plus Steve and Geraldine Janicke, Libby Sandiford, Pete Dawson, Keven Giles, Russell Peterkin, Bill and Jane Thompson, Ric Pepper and Gil Craig who have helped out at Twertup a number of times in the last months. Our State NRM grant is partpaying for the stonemason, along with a Foundation for National Parks and Wildlife grant.

The next stage will be installing the wall plates, ceilings and in-fill between the top of the walls and the roof which will be paid for by a Great Southern Development Commission 'Community Chest Fund' grant, for which we are very grateful

Our recent achievements at Twertup will be on show on Sunday 12th April (AGM weekend). Please come along and, if you feel like doing a bit of work, there will be many blocks to shift to delineate paths around the quarry. Bring gloves and any useful instruments, such as a rake, mattock or wheelbarrow. Looking forward to seeing you there....


